## **CCF- 4<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> Grade - You're Not My Friend!**

The theme this past week for our older CCF students was 'Your Not My Friend'. Between ages 4<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade, we see so many children **grappling** with this problem. Often times the students perceive themselves as 'unpopular' when, in reality, they are well-liked. Several things play into this dynamic but one of the biggest problems is the fact that kids feel such pressure to grow up and be adult-like before they are emotionally ready to do so. The ones that act more mature are perceived as more popular, therefore creating this vicious cycle that perpetuates the idea that the older you act, the cooler you are. This situation can breed behaviors in children that we, as parents and teachers, try to discourage such as trying drugs and alcohol, stealing, lying, 'dating' before they are ready etc. The peer pressure is always there. Those without coping tools and opportunities to discuss these pressures are left feeling confuse and longing for acceptance at any cost.

The lesson last week was a good one because it allowed our youth time for open discussion about this very issue described above. Every one in the class had something to contribute and could identify with this problem. One game we played to teach this lesson encouraged kids to talk with a partner but there were some challenging rules to this game. Each child was assigned a part of speech (noun, adjective or verb) and could only speak using his assigned part. If I paired a noun with a verb, conversation was difficult, challenging and uncomfortable at times. If I paired a noun with a noun, the rules allowed those kids to talk in regular sentences, which was quite easy and uncomplicated. Lesson learned.... The more they have in common with someone, the easier it is to be friends BUT, that does not mean they should just choose people who are exactly like them with which to be friends. Rather, children learned that they need to branch out and try to bridge the gaps with those that are different from them and let others know we accept them for who they are. Acceptance is what we all want and what God tells us to give one another. It was fun and challenging. We then looked up chapters and verses in the Bible that teach us to be kind and friendly with all people, not just those that look a certain way, serve us at the time or those that we are most like. The focus of the lesson was that 'God made us all in His image', therefore we are all alike in the most fundamental ways.

Youth also continued their Praise and Worship journey, playing instruments, singing and, most importantly, praising God through music. We are currently working on several songs that will eventually be sung and played for the congregation once we feel ready. Madeira Miller did a fantastic job of singing Amazing Grace during 10:30 service last Sunday. Way to go Madeira! Amazing Grace is one of our Praise and Worship songs we have been working on with instruments so we are looking forward to singing and playing it again as a group very soon.

Children in this age group had great fun listening to their Bible story on CD and then they played two fun games to support the lesson. The first game allowed each child to sit on and pop a balloon holding a piece of paper with a question on it. The questions were things like, "How can I be kind to someone who does not have a friend to play with at recess?" The kids loved popping balloons and learning at the same time.

The other game was simply sitting in a circle and passing around a 'surprise box' while music was playing. When the music stopped, the child holding the box opened it and read the message out loud, which was "Be Kind To Others... Pass It On!" They loved getting to be the one to open the surprise box and then passing on this important message to a friend!

This age-group is also practicing songs that they will sing for the congregation. One of the songs is the same one our older group is working on, called Here I Am To Worship. This is a really beautiful song that truly moves the spirit. We are looking forward to sharing it with everyone soon. 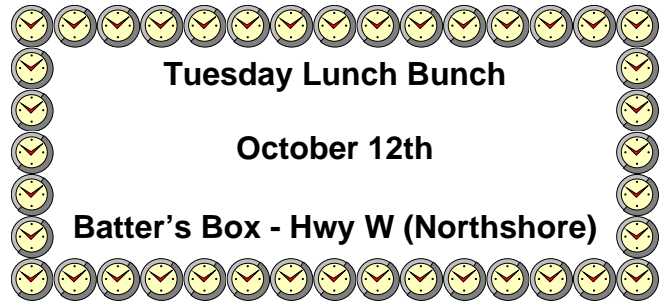
## Hope House

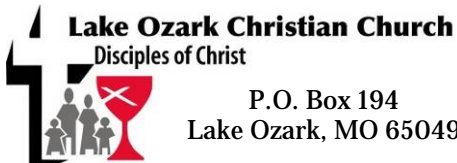
